Sette Giugno Monument

Where in Valletta should the Sette Giugno monument be permanently placed?

Sette Giugno is a national holiday celebrated annually on 7 June. It commemorates events which occurred on that day in 1919.

On June 7, 1986 the Sette Giugno monument was inaugurated at St George Square, Valletta.

Due to the renovation of St. George Square the monument was temporarily removed from the square, but even after the works were completed, it was kept stored.

Due to great public appeal against the storage of such a nationally important monument, it was placed in Hastings Gardens, Valletta by the previous administration.

In view of this, a public consultation is being launched in order to establish an appropriate permanent location for this national memorial.

Aim: The general public is being invited to submit views and suggestions as to where this national monument should be permanently placed.

Considerations: The public should keep in mind that the monument should be placed in the vicinity of where the riots were held, in an appropriate and possibly open space where the annual commemorative ceremony can take place and in respect of the monument's size.
